Nanking Cherry (*Prunus tomentosa*)

A winter hardy, moderately fast-growing, medium shrub. Broad spreading, densely twiggy, becoming more open & picturesque with age. Also called Manchu cherry. Edible fruits are dark red - excellent for pies and jellies. Fruit is relished by many song birds. Provides nesting cover for a few species of songbirds.



Flowering Package for Small Acreages

For landowners that want to plant trees, but don't want 25 of one kind.

Redosier Dogwood (*Cornus sericea*)

An open-spreading, multi-stemmed, medium to large shrub for farmstead, field windbreaks & riparian plantings. Horizontal branches at base. Fruit & twigs are used by several species of wildlife: robins, cedar waxwings, rabbits & deer. Provides dense cover for several species.



Sand Cherry (*Prunus besseyi*)

Sandcherry is a low growing shrub native to western Nebraska. It has showy white flowers in May and produces small, sweet, purplish-black cherries in July. Sandcherry can tolerate hot, dry conditions, and prefers well-drained soils. The cherries are especially good for making jelly or jam.



Serviceberry (*Amelanchier alnifolia*)

Also called Juneberry & Saskatoon; is popular for its good tasting fruit similar to blueberry in looks and taste. Slow-growing, mid to tall, thicket forming shrub that blooms in late spring. Big game browse on leaves & twigs while songbirds and upland game savor the fruit. Leaf spots, rust and pear slugs can be problematic.



Caragana

(*Caragana arborescens*)

Caragana, also called Siberian peashrub, is a large upright shrub. It provides dense cover for wildlife and is ideal for the shrub row in a windbreak. Caragana is adaptable to conditions of extreme cold and wind. It tolerates a wide range of soil types, including alkaline and saline soils.
